It was only eight months ago that I was ending a term as my chapter's alumni secretary. It was only seven months ago that I was appointed Province Alumni Coordinator for Province 29. It was only six months ago that I was working as a long-term substitute teacher in a Wisconsin school district and looking for a school that needed a music teacher.



It was only five months ago that everything changed.

Today, I have the honor of greeting my brothers as the Director of Alumni Affairs. To have predicted that my life would have led me on the road to Lyrecrest would have been unthinkable. The Grissom Library now includes most of the works that comprise the standard repertoire of the trombone. Included are compositions for solo trombone, trombone with keyboard, concerti, and diverse chamber works which feature the trombone. The library is administered by Arthur Jennings, professor of Low Brass, who selects and purchases the music and recordings each year and installs them in the Music Library's permanent collection.

## Coe Professor Authors Book to Document Successful Community Band

The story of John Paynter, Barbara Buehlman, and other important musicians unfolds as they guide the Northshore Concert Band on the path to excellence.

Author William S. Carson, Director of Bands at Coe College in Cedar Rapids, Iowa and Business Manager of the Municipal Band in Cedar Rapids, is a 1978 honors graduate of Macalester College in St. Paul, Minnesota. Carson continued his studies at Southern Illinois University-Carbondale where he earned a Master of Music degree in 1981.

Carson later moved to Arizona to pursue his Doctor of Musical Arts degree at Arizona State University. Carson spent two years as a graduate assistant for the ASU Bands and an intern with the orchestra before he was appointed Director of Bands at Coe College in Cedar Rapids, Iowa.

At Coe Carson conducts the concert band and the jazz band; teaches conducting, 20th century music history, clarinet, and jazz history; and supervises the rest of the instrumental music faculty. Carson completed his doctorate in 1992, and two years later was awarded the Outstanding Dissertation Award from the Council for Research in Music Education.

## A Brother's First Iron Man Wisconsin Experience

I felt good all morning. The swim went well as I felt comfortable and exited the water at 8:37. Trouble started as soon as I got on the bike with a flat tire costing me some time. Once I got on the road, I could not get comfortable. I felt bloated, but hadn't taken in a lot of water. I attempted to drink some fluids but they didn't sit well.

I hit the beginning of the loop about 10:20, a bit off my planned paced. As I entered the loop, I didn't have any gas in the tank and taking in fluids compounded the issue in my stomach. I felt sluggish and my legs felt flat. I headed around for the second loop with more of the same. Unfortunately, the temperature had risen to 88 degrees and the winds had picked up considerably.

I walked through Timber and Midtown, since my last encounters with each cost my body dearly for the ensuing 15 minutes. I tried to pick up the pace as I knew I was close on time. I figured if I could hit the park around 4:30, I could make the 5:30 cutoff. So I cruised into town around 4:20 and stopped at the aid station for one last fill up.

I put the pedal down and hit the corner by the park at 4:35pm. A friend was on the corner and yelled, "You can make it if you keep it steady." Then another guy yelled "No problem, you have a tail wind all the way in." Unfortunately, that tailwind changed to a swirling crosswind.

Had it been a straightaway, I could have made the distance back to the terrace, but weaving through the back parking lot, dodging traffic, and underpasses, I knew it wasn't going to happen. So I did what I have said all along, finish strong. As I headed up the Helix,

I got out of the saddle and "let 'er rip." I passed my wife on level two, and almost fell over at level four once I realized how high a gear I was in.

I hit the breaks at the dismount line, got off my bike, and jumped on the timing mat. I looked up and saw "15:30:12" on the clock and for a split second thought I may have been really close, but I realized the clock was stopped. A gentleman came up and apologized for having to take my timing chip. I missed the bike cut-off by seven minutes. I told him he needn't be sorry, I knew coming in would be a slim chance.

Next thing I know, some dude from Iron Man Live sticks a camera in my face and asks me what happened. So I told him about my day, and what an amazing experience this has been.
