



MEMBERSHIP EXCLUSIVITY

"A chapter may not pledge or initiate a man who is a member of any other secret national fraternal society in music. A member agrees not to join any other secret national fraternal society in music."

National Constitution & Bylaws
Bylaws, Title I. Article. I. Section 4

Individuals who have been initiated into the following fraternities are not eligible for membership with Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia and vice versa, regardless of membership status or current standing with the other organization.



Mu Phi Epsilon Fraternity

Founded November 13, 1903 at the Metropolitan College of Music in Cincinnati, Ohio.

Co-Ed Professional Music Fraternity aimed at the advancement of music in the community, nation, and world through promotion of musicianship, scholarship, therapy, and education, with an emphasis on service through music.



Phi Beta Fraternity

Founded May 5, 1912 at Northwestern University in Evanston, Illinois.

Co-Ed Professional Fraternity for the creative and performing arts aimed to promote the best in the creative and performing arts, to live a life of service, and to seek and develop the highest type of humanity.



Delta Omicron Fraternity

Founded September 6, 1909 at the Cincinnati Conservatory of Music in Cincinnati, Ohio.

Co-Ed Professional Music Fraternity aimed to promote and support excellence in music and musicianship.

Attempting to pledge/initiate into any of these other Fraternities is a violation of the *National Constitution & Bylaws* as well as a violation of your Oath of Obligation.

Expulsion from any of the organizations listed above does NOT make an individual eligible for membership with Phi Mu Alpha and vice-versa.
